**Re: U.S. CITIZENS IN A FOREIGN LEGISLATURE VOTING TO
EXCLUDE U.S. CITIZENS FROM EXECUTIVE OFFICE**

Dear Members of the Committee:

I bring to the Committee a matter within its oversight of United States foreign relations and the treatment of United States citizens abroad.

Three sitting Senators of the United Mexican States, Javier Corral Jurado (El Paso, Texas), Cecilia Guadiana Mandujano (Laredo, Texas), and Ricardo Sheffield Padilla (Los Angeles, California), are United States citizens by birth. On September 29, 2026, that Senate is scheduled to vote on a reform of Articles 82, 116 and 122 of its Constitution that would bar persons holding another nationality from the Presidency, the governorships and the Head of Government of Mexico City, and would require anyone seeking those offices to renounce U.S. citizenship.

The reform requires two-thirds of the senators present. The bloc advancing it holds 87 seats and, with one announced no vote, has no votes to spare. The three named senators belong to that bloc.

As a result, United States citizens, from a foreign legislature, would vote to constitutionalize that U.S. citizenship disqualifies a person from that country's highest offices. I respectfully

ask the Committee to note this fact for the record, to consider it in the annual human-rights reporting on Mexico, and to support the Department of State's review under 8 U.S.C. Section 1481, filed on this same date for each of the three senators.

I assert no guilt and condition no vote. I ask only that facts of public record be examined by the authorities to whom they belong. Exhibit A is attached.
